FREMONT KAIROS #23

We arrived in Chapter 7 -- bankrupt, but all searching for something. We found love, joy, peace, renewal, touchy-feelys, hope, faith, people that know God, a loving safe community of believers. We're taking away with us: Jesus, forgiveness, cookies, new responsibility, a family that cares and is available. Our table family is from many nationalities and races; we became united in Jesus.

One of us found a new job — he was a journeyman plumber, and is now a journeyman for Jesus.

I've taken Jesus into my heart with this guarantee: If I don't like it, after 90 days I can get my misery back.

The letters in my palanca bag really touched me — I cried. I' thought I knew what love was, but that was worldly love. I forgave all those people I hated, all those I hurt, even my cousin I was going to kill. God showed me He's got something better for me. Now I can learn with my brothers here, and don't have to show that macho image all the time.

Without Jesus we have nothing in this world. I received the Holy Spirit here, was forgiven and forgave all those people. When I saw all you people tonight, I felt so much of God's love here again. I'm going to walk that narrow path now—the wide path got me in here.

When they gave us that extra cookie bag last night to give to the one we hated most or our worst enemy back there, I thought about several guys. But I ended up giving it to myself, because I've been my own worst enemy.

I've learned to discern, instead of to fault-find.

The palanca from all over the world made a <u>tremendous</u> impression of love!

I can't stand to be around love! It really scares me

We had names, then we had numbers, now we have a new name: Forgiven.

We came to prison. We built walls. Now where are them walls?

It's time for us to be honest with ourselves, time to start forgiving, time to be assertive about Jesus Christ.

No matter how much you know about Jesus, it's love that holds us together in the body of Christ. And I saw that love in the palanca bags, the letters, and when we came in here and saw you singing 'Surely the Presence' with us.

"As the world grows darker and darker, the light of the saints grows brighter and brighter."

WOMEN'S KAIROS #22

I was a prostitute and was selling myself. Now I've received Christ and I'm going to be Baptized and I'm going to give myself away to Him!

I found a friend; we found a friend; the Lord our Savior is our friend.

If God loves and cares about us, and you love and care about us, maybe we can learn to love and care about ourselves.

I learned how much love there is in this world, and how Satan was trying to get to me thru hate and lies; but I found love here and my tears now are for joy.

I want everyone to know that Satan is a liar.

I want to tell Satan that Jesus took over!

The only way I can show my appreciation for all this love is to go back inside there and show that love to others.

I always know I'd be in prison ministry some day, but this way? Yes, I found my ministry here, so be careful what you pray for.

I've been down so many roads and turned my back on Him so many times, but He never turned His back on me. You don't have to run into the same wall so many times to know it's a wall. You've to serve only one master, Jesus, the Lord.

Before I came here, I didn't know there were people like you out there. There are people in here who don't see the person behind the number, but I know God sees me as a person and forgives me. I'm learning to forgive myself and I'm going to let my light shine.

I'm telling you we're all God's children and we're the best!

You always saw me with a smile, a mask. I'm going to try to let that mask down and let Jesus into my life.

I thought I could get through this being tough, but that doesn't work with all you guys loving me.

I used to want to just get out of here and get high, but now I just want the Lord. I've forgiven my Dad and Mom for raping me and this weekend has really helped me do that.

What they took away from me in here, that's nothing. They can't hurt me, because I have Jesus in my heart and I know He's always going to take care of me.
