FROM THE CHAIRMAN

At the Kairos Board of Director's Meeting in August the National Board changed the name of our ministry from "Kairos Prison Ministry, Inc." to "Kairos Prison Ministry International, Inc." The Executive Director of the ministry has put out a challenge:

> "...we need a vision of Kairos that is so large it can not be accomplished without God's help. That's a dream worth having!"

At the Kairos Summer Conference in August we saw the breadth of the Kairos vision -- international expansion, fiscal stability, new songbooks and manuals, and Qualifying Weekends to boost the number of volunteers. Really exciting!

So at our Colorado State Committee meeting on 13 September we spent a day in prayer and visioning, using a combination of the strategic planning process and the "Prayer of Jabez" to develop a strategic plan. We asked ourselves the questions:

"Where do we want to be on our 25th anniversary in 2007? How will we get there?"

Here is an outline of the answers your Committee came up with.

1. We plan to facilitate the recruiting of more volunteers — more in numbers and more diverse.

Expect to see an Outreach Coordinator appointed to train each facility on the Kairos recruiting film and database. Also, we are planning a Qualifying Weekend for 2004.

- 2. We will prepare for expansion into new facilities and new states starting with policy guidelines and a systematic analysis of expansion opportunities.
- 3. We need to provide guidance and training to foster effective leadership at the State level and at the facility level. Look for by-laws, job descriptions, guidelines for Advisory Councils, seminars and training sessions, and a program self-assessment.
- 4. We will pioneer an aftercare extension for Kairos. This will include assisting ex-offenders in their return to society through integration programs, mentoring, and funding.

With this vision of the future, we invite each Kairos volunteer to join us in proclaiming:

"Come and see what God has done in Kairos. His deeds are awesome!" (Psalm 66:5 adapted)

GEMS FROM RECENT CLOSINGS

I asked my judge to give me two additional months so I could be on this Kairos. I can now say "In Jesus' name" without being hypocritical.

Now I know exactly who I am: a child of God. I have no doubt that God loves me.

When I grow up I want to be just like all of you ladies.

In here there are all these rules — you know: do this, do that. Now I know the biggest rule is to love each other.

It's not so much what we're taking with us as what we're leaving behind.

I came in with a little candle of light; now I have a big campfire of light in Christ.

We found people who care, and they don't care what we did to get here.

I'm no longer just an individual; I have brothers here who care

I found the individual strength to witness.

Walls came down.

Don't need a gang homey anymore. God is my homey.

There's a lot of men here projecting strength in violent, arrogant ways. In Kairos I found men of real strength.

I never experienced such deep love. I am a converted Christian Muslim. I am on a quest. I need your prayer support for my family in [Africa], since they are still Muslim, in darkness — for their safety.

I've come away a different man; I used to say "Been there, done that," but I've never "been there and done that!" I accepted Christ.

Kairos is a family of men and Christ, come together for fellowship. I have been looking for the right kind of family, failed until now. <u>This</u> is it!

The Lord has put an unbelievable peace in me. For seven long years my heart was in pain and anger, then last night I gave it all to the Lord — and I have peace.
