### EVANGELISM IN PRISON

One definition of Evangelism is "to convey the Good News of Jesus Christ in such a way that persons can truly understand, believe, accept, and make it central in their everyday lives". That's a big order anywhere and is especially challenging in the negative environment of prison.

Kairos approaches evangelism in a manner which conveys God's boundless love for all of us, even those whom could have labeled "garbage". A prison Chaplain, labeled "garbage". It has said, "Kairos is love in action. is, by far, the most dynamic and effective program for changing the lives of incarcerated men and women I have ever seen." Typical inmate responses iinclude, "No one ever told me God could and does love me.", "I never knew what real love is, but now I do.", and "I finally believe that God forgives me, and I know that someday, with His help, I'll be able to forgive myself."

Kairos (Greek for "God's Special Time"), conveys God's love primarily through a 3-day Short Course of solid Christian teaching. The outside team gives 14 talks on a carefully structured sequence of topics, all of which include personal witness as to how God has touched the speaker's life in that particular subject area. These are interspersed with Chapel meditations, prayers, singing, home-cooked meals (and lots of home-baked cookies), and much smallgroup and one-on-one sharing.

One emphasis is on experiencing God's love through Christian community. The team becomes a loving community through their team formation meetings before each Short Course. Then they can <u>live</u> that community, not just talk about it. In addition to the outside team, inmates who have made a previous Short Course join the team community, demonstrating "agape" love in their service to their fellow inmates.

A major emphasis is FORGIVENESS -- how to avail ourselves of God's forgiveness and accept it, and the necessity of forgiving others and ourselves, again and again, in order to maintain a close relationship with God.

For maintaining a balanced Christian life, Kairos teaches a small Share and Prayer Group support method. Such a group helps keep us aware of our day-today relationship with God and each other. The group builds up each member, prays together, and reminds us that, while a personal relationship with God is vital, we are never alone in our Christian walk.

By the way, virtually the same Short Course experience and ongoing method is available to us outside of prison through Cursillo or Walk to Emmaus. Kairos team members must have that experience in order to serve on a team.

Kairos is a ministry of continuing presence in a prison by means of the twice yearly Short Course for new candidates, twice yearly 2-day Residents Retreats for any who have made a previous Short Course, and monthly Reunion meetings, open to all, of the inside and outside Christian communities.

Through all of these facets of the Kairos prison ministry, God's love is conveyed again and again. Outsiders who are willing to drive long distances and invest their time in inmates' lives are a powerful demonstration of God's love for us all.

The Good News is that God loves us so much that Christ died for us and rose from the dead so we can be forgiven and live in fellowship with Him for all eternity. Kairos conveys that Good News in word and deed, here and now, to those in prison.

#### SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING --

-- Witnessing for Christ

"Be ready at all times to answer anyone who asks you to explain the hope you have in you." (1 Peter 3:15 GNB) In order to be witnesses for Christ, we must indeed "be ready" to respond to others in such ways as will draw them closer to the Lord. We must remember that our witness should be short enough to hold our hearer's attention (around five minutes), be relevant to our everyday lives, and glorify Jesus. Here are some tips gleaned from the Faith Alive newsletter:

Make three lists: #1 "Before I asked Jesus into my life", #2 "How I asked Him to come in", and #3 "How Jesus has changed my life now that He is my Savior and Lord."

On #1, list several events or brief descriptions of yourself that would give others insight into your life before you made a commitment to Jesus Christ as Lord.

On #2, describe the circumstances and the event of your meeting Jesus, with only enough detail to make it real to your listeners. Detail is important so that it doesn't sound vague, but a real event.

On #3, list several ways that Jesus has changed your life. Emphasize new growth experiences and recently answered prayers. Be sure these give glory to Jesus, and not to yourself.

Review your lists often enough to remember their contents easily. A witness is not a confession. Avoid matters of doctrine, other churches, religions, and negatives about your church or any other. Give glory to God, not to Kairos, Cursillo, Emmaus, Faith Alive, or any other ministry or person.

The Holy Spirit will no doubt change your "witness" from time to time, up-dating list #3, but keeping these lists well in mind will help you to follow His lead easily and naturally with whichever parts of your story will be relevant to your hearer. Remember, too, that our "witness" is not only in being called to speak, but in our gentle and loving attitude toward everyone we meet.


