SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

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WATCH — AND BE READY!

In a few days the Gregorian calendar will have us in a year labeled "2000." Fascinating, yes - like watching your car odometer turn to all zeros, as ours just did. But significant?

To some, yes. They link this man-made calendar event to the future God-made "millennium" that period of a "thousand years" during which Satan will be bound and Jesus will reign triumphant (Revelation 20:2-7). They base this linkage on the scripture passage "With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day" (Psalm 90:4 and 2 Peter 3:8), coupled with the seven days of Creation and the Biblical number of years since Adam — 4000 years before the birth of Christ and 2000 years after. They assert that each Creation day represents one thousand years, the first six days are now accounted for, and the remaining day represents the "thousand years" described in Revelation. Thus they say that the beginning of the next calendar millennium equates with the beginning of The Biblical Millennium. So watch out! All kinds of awful things will happen as we enter Y2K, only a few of which will be due to computer programmers. Beware! It's gloom and doom for some, the Millennial Reign of Jesus for others.

There are a few practical problems with this. Historians have determined that the birth of Christ was probably four years earlier than originally calculated by the founders of our calendar. It was in the year 4 BC. This means that we are already about two years into the seventh Biblical millennium. Nothing apocalyptic happened when we crossed into it — i.e. on 1 January 1998. Also, even if the starting year of the Gregorian calendar were anchored to the correct year of Christ's birth, the beginning of 2000 AD would still not be significant, because the new millennium in that calendar won't really begin until 1 January 2001.

Jesus told the Pharisees, "The kingdom of God does not come with your careful observation, nor will people say, 'Here it is,' or 'There it is,' because the kingdom of God is within you" (Luke 17:20,21).

What Jesus was saying is that it is not for us to figure out the time of the Second Advent. "No one knows about that day or hour, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father" (Matthew 24:36). In other words, we shouldn't spend our efforts on figuring out the "when." What we should be doing is making sure we are ready — as Jesus then told them: "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know the day or the hour" (Matthew 25:13, Acts 1:7). To make His point, He told them the parable of the ten bridesmaids (Matthew 25:1-13) which says, in effect, make sure you have oil in your lamp! Be ready, "Continue in Him, so that when He appears we may be confident and unashamed before Him at His coming" (1 John 2:28). Be confident! "Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when He appears, we shall be like Him, for we shall see Him as He is" (1 John 3:2,3).

The prisons will still be there in January 2000. The electrically operated gates will still be working. The lights will still be on. The Light of Jesus will still be there, and in us — in the hearts of all of those who love Him. Be confident! God will not forsake us: "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you!" (Deuteronomy 31:6 and Hebrews 13:5).

I came a nobody, a backslider. I found I can be forgiven. I was lost but now I know I can get back on the right track.

WE ARE GROWING


