FROM THE CHAIRPERSON

Dear Kairos Community in Colorado,
Sadly, I have to report that our ministry has been suspended at Fremont Correctional Facility until January 2006 for security reasons.

We have been given a list of volunteers who have served recently at Fremont. Everyone on the list has to retake the BVT (the 8-hour Basic Volunteer Training) before being allowed back into any DOC facility. After that training they will be permitted to participate in Kairos events in any DOC facility except Fremont, where there will be no Kairos events until after 1 January 2006.

It is important to know that God's work in ministering within Fremont through the Advisory Council and volunteers is not in question. We all know how much work is involved, and we sincerely and deeply appreciate the volunteers. The Prayer and Share Groups and Monthly Reunions at Fremont are testimony to God's work in the Body of Christ at Fremont through the Kairos volunteers. I believe this situation is a gift from God and that the ministry will be blessed and better after January 2006. I ask all Kairos volunteers to pray thanksgiving for God's plan for this ministry and the revelation of His blessing to us.

Security is, of course, the first concern of the DOC, and we must heed the message we have been given. I ask all Kairos volunteers to prayerfully consider the unique mission field to which God has called us. I quote below from the 2005 edition of the Kairos Program Manual.

"The cornerstone of the ministry is the relationship between the Advisory Council and the prison institution... It is essential that the Kairos Leader recognize his/her responsibility in preserving and

nurturing this relationship. The Kairos Leader must be constantly aware of the activities of every member of their team and sensitive as to acts that might have the potential to do harm to this precious relationship. The Leader must realize and accept that the first concern of the institution is SECURITY. At all times the Kairos Leader must function with the understanding that Kairos is A GUEST IN THE WARDEN'S HOUSE and is there at the discretion of the warden... Kairos volunteers are grateful to be guests in the Institution and respect the house rules. Kairos volunteers are expected to follow the rules of the Institution, designed to achieve the top priority goal of the Warden and staff in providing security to the residents, officials, and visitors. Even when rules are in conflict with the desires of a Kairos Team member, serving in obedience ... is expected."

The state committee will try to find out how men of good will could get crosswise with a purpose we all share so strongly. We are not looking for fault. We should learn God's message to us to improve the ministry in the future at Fremont and everywhere in Colorado. And we must, of course, make changes satisfactory to the DOC if we are to be invited back in. I ask the cooperation of all volunteers involved as we ask questions.

Security is, in one sense, easy to deal with – DOC gives us rules, and we obey them without question. This is the time to show we are capable of that, especially the "without question" part. I ask all volunteers to refrain from trying to negotiate any exemption, exception, exclusion – anything – to the list we will be given. The list is a security rule – as iron

NEW START AT BRUSH

When you seek me with all your heart, I will be found by you, says the Lord. (Jeremiah 29: 13-14)

So it was on June 2-5, 2005, as we held our first 4-day Weekend at the Brush Women's Facility. God was ready for us. He had planned our weekend since our first Monthly Reunion in October 2004. When we entered the facility, we were greeted with "Hurry inside ladies, there is a tornado warning". We took this opportunity to sing praises to God and to pray. God removed the warning and we moved into a truly spirit-filled weekend.

We were blessed with 18 candidates (30 had signed up) and 8 kitchen angels. Our team numbered 24, including 10 new members. There was a lot of excitement and anticipation as we moved into meeting our candidates for the first time on Thursday night. Friday brought more sharing. Several ladies said they "just wanted to come for a couple of meals and then leave, but 'something' changed their minds." The team talks were powerful and showed much vulnerability, which increased the candidates' trust. By Saturday morning, the table leaders heard reports of several candidates getting together for prayer and also praying for and with other residents with whom they had conflict. The table leaders were amazed that God had shown up Saturday morning, even before the forgiveness talks had begun.

The weekend was not without tension and challenges, but we saw the Holy Spirit move in dramatic ways to bring about His intent for everyone. The Holy Spirit protected the candidates as well as the table leaders from any potential distraction. This allowed Him to break down walls, release pain, soften the ladies' hearts, and transform lives right before our eyes. As a result of His Mercy and Grace, one lady gave her heart to the Lord and 5 others returned to Him. Praise the Lord!!!

As part of our contract with the Brush facility, we were able to cook the noon and dinner meals in our separate kitchen area. The kitchen team worked diligently making our meals, wonderful deserts, and tons of cookies. Their talents and endeavors brought much joy to the candidates and to our team.

There were 80 people in attendance for the closing. What a gift everyone gave to the ladies as they entered the gym to singing, smiling faces. One resident exclaimed, "I have a new family now", as she gestured to the audience. Many at the gathering were moved to tears and astonished by the testimonies which were shared. Only one lady mentioned the food!! Rather, they were quick to give God the glory and praise Him for the changes in their lives. Captain Werner, Program Administrator, expressed appreciation to those present and encouraged the participants to share their
